Game Responsibilities

General Rules

All player medical release forms (yellow copies) must be in possession of the Manager or Coach at all practices and games.

No food is allowed in dugouts except sunflower seeds. No drinks are allowed in dugouts except water, or sport drinks in plastic bottles.

Home

The Home team is responsible for field preparation before the game. This includes:

- Unlocking bathrooms, scorebooth, and snack shack
- Turning on lights if necessary
- Turning on the scoreboard (if applicable)
- Setting bases
- Chalking the field
- Turning off field lights once the snack shack is closed

The **Home** team manager/and, or coaches of the last game of the day *must remain at the field* until the snack shack is closed, all volunteers are ready to leave, and the field lights have been shut off.

For games at Pioneer Park, the **Home** team shall provide three (3) adult volunteers to work the snack shack, who must arrive no later than 45 minutes before the game start-time.

AAA Minors and above: In addition to three snack shack volunteers, the **Home** team must provide someone to keep the official scorebook, and to work the scoreboard.

The **Home** team is responsible for making sure that the official scorebook is signed by the head umpire and scorekeeper.

Visitors

The **Visiting** team is responsible for field grooming and clean-up after the game, if no other game follows. This includes:

- Dragging/raking the field
- Storing all equipment--including bases. Replace base plugs
- Emptying and relining trash cans (including taking out trash from snack shack)
- Locking restrooms and scorekeeper's booth, and securing the parking area chain.
- Turning off the scoreboard (AAA Minors and above)

AA Minors and above: The **Visiting** team (either local, or inter-league) shall provide the official pitch count recorder. The pitch count recorder will enter all pitch count data onto the official Little League Baseball Pitcher Eligibility tracking form, which will be countersigned by the scorekeeper, or head-umpire at the end of the game and filed with the official scorebook (for AAA Minors and above). It is the **Visiting Manager's** responsibility to have the pitch count tracking form signed off after the game. The official pitch count recorder is available for download on the Nevada City Little League website.

Both teams are responsible for cleaning out their respective dugouts.

Inter-league games (Minors and above)

The Home team is responsible for all of the above, except those related to pitch count recorder.
